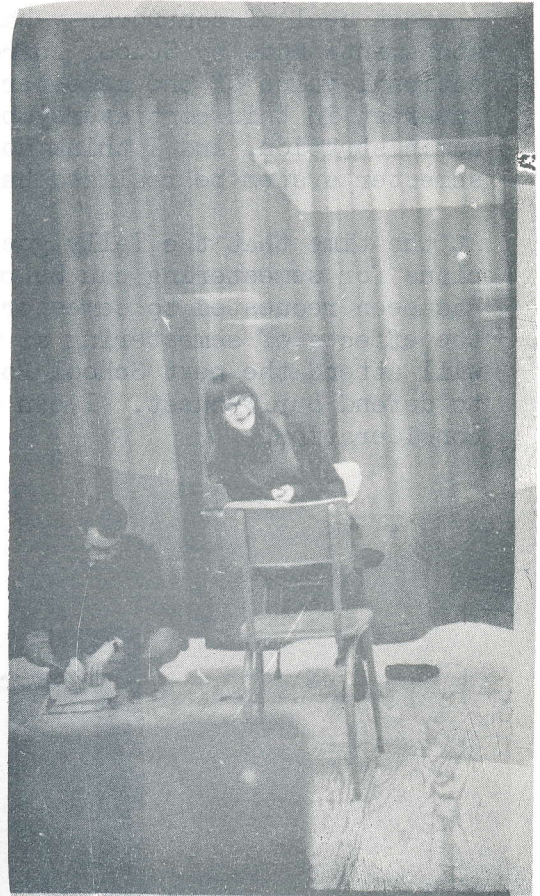
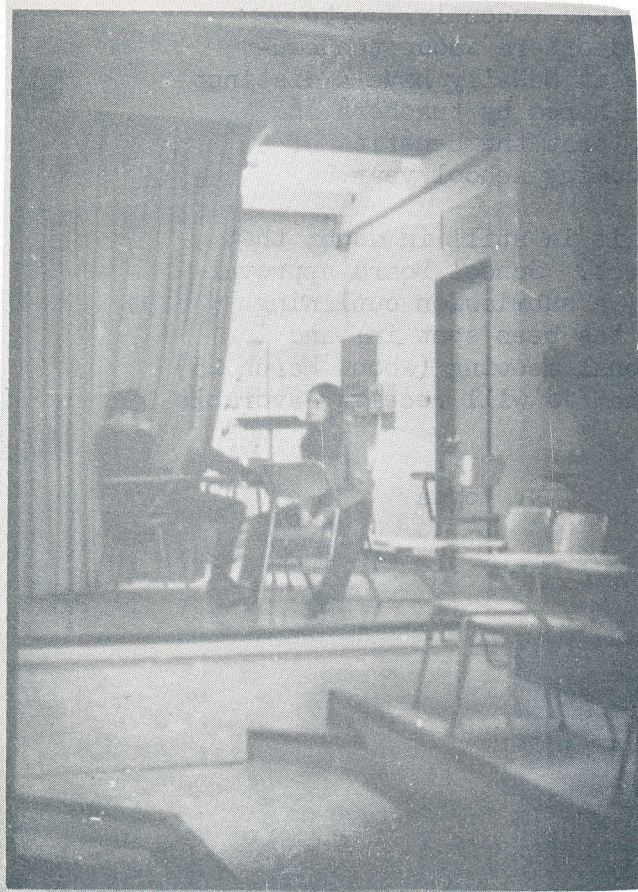




THE TALLY

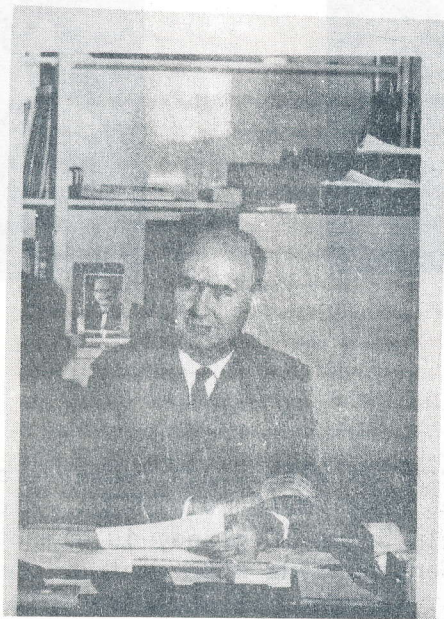

THE SEMESTER SYSTEM

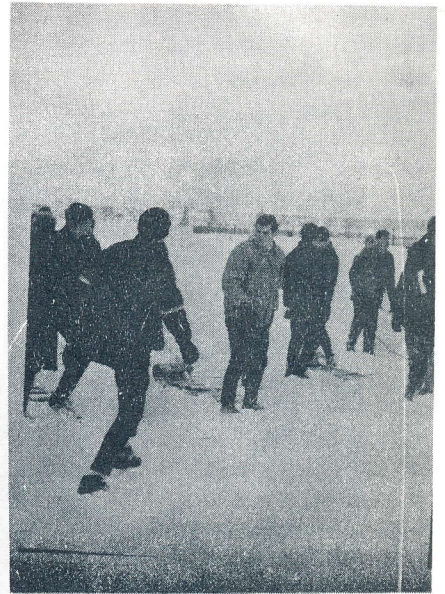

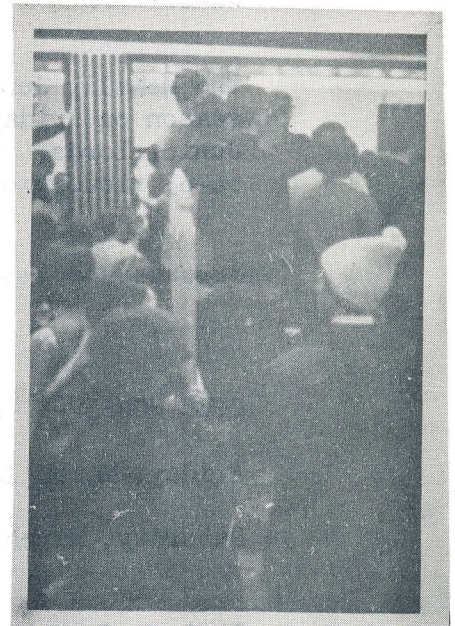
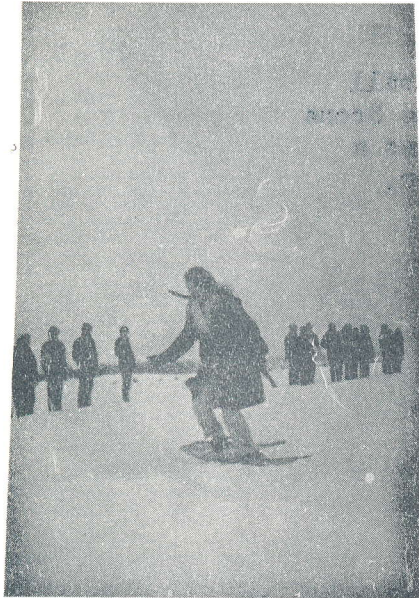
